


Fig 4. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values





Fig 5. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values




Fig 6. Output characteristics: drain current as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values


Fig 7. Sub-threshold drain current as a function of gate-source voltage


Fig 8. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of drain current; typical values



Fig 9. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values





Fig 10. Transfer characteristics: drain current as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values





Fig 11. Normalized drain-source on-state resistance as a function of junction temperature; typical values





Fig 14. Gate-source voltage as a function of gate charge; typical values






Fig 15. Gate charge waveform definitions




Fig 18. Package outline SOT23 (TO-236AB)




Fig 19. Reflow soldering footprint for SOT23 (TO-236AB)




Fig 20. Wave soldering footprint for SOT23 (TO-236AB)
